2023 Year End Summary and Updates. By PACOG MPO 1.10.24 (revised)

City of Pueblo Projects:

- Rapids Place (Pillars Park & Kayak Park Entrance)- Complete, waiting on Black Hills Energy to install the lights going down to Pillars Park. Also waiting on installation of railing along the sidewalk.
- Lake Minnequa Connector Trail: Completed except for landscaping (solar lighting installed!). While visiting this location I saw five people using this new trail. I spoke with two, and asked them about the trail, if they like it and if they use it often. One of them who was a teenager said he likes it and it is great for skateboarding. The elderly person who I spoke with said he walks his dog everyday on it and enjoys it.
- Wildhorse Creek Trail: Design has not yet started and the City does not know when construction will begin.
- **Northern Avenue Trail:** The plans are close, but CDOT clearances are still needed. Construction may start fall of 2024.
- Haaff SRTS: Currently working on ROW plans and easement acquisition, so the City is unsure of construction date.
- Parkview SRTS: The City is working with CDOT for an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA)
- Union and Main Street: unsure of when construction will start.
- 2023 Overlay Projects Completed. Troy and Joplin now have bike lanes.
- RAISE Grant: Working through the IGA with FHWA
- Safe Streets For All: Working on RFP for traffic study.
- Applied for Multimodal Transportation and Mitigation Options Fund (MMOF) and Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) for CO State Fair pedestrian improvements (Beulah/Small/Arroyo).

Pueblo Conservancy District:

 Arkansas Levee Project: All current phases completed. The connection from Levee Trail to Wildhorse Creek is complete.

Pueblo County Projects:

Parks and Recreation:

- St. Charles Mesa Complex Trail: a crusher fine trail has been built around the Parks and Recreation Campus. 1.1 miles total.
- Pueblo County Parks and recreation applied to utilize MMOF for bike lanes on the mesa (Everett Rd, Aspen Road, 25th Lane, & 30th lane).

Public Works:

- Medal of Honor Trail: The east/west leg is currently out to bid.
- Industrial and Purcell Blvd; working with CDOT for an IGA for intersection design which will include connecting the SDS Trail to the southwest corner where CDOT completed their work.
- Paved Aspen Road and Roselawn Road. Striped wide shoulders for bicycle and pedestrian use on Roselawn Road.
- Applied for MMOF and CRP for electric vehicle chargers at Sangre de Cristo Arts Center.

Pueblo West Metropolitan District Parks and Recreation:

- Nichols Trail and Pedestrian Bridge: installation by end of January 2024
- SDS Trail: Complete
- Joe Martinez Trail: Currently being designed.
- Purcell Trail: working with CDOT for an IGA.
- Applied for MMO funding for the construction of a trail around Civic Center
 Park Trail to connect with existing trails nearby. Will submit an application for
 Multimodal Transportation and Mitigation Options Fund (MMOF) and Carbon
 Reduction Program.



- An RFP for a vanpool will be released Jan. 2024, this subsidized program will benefit employers that do not have accessibility to the Pueblo's Transit System.
- Pueblo Youth continue to ride free year around.
- Applied for MMO funding for solar lighting to be installed at 33 bus stops through out the city.

MPO:

- Completed 5 Complete Street Workshops that included two walk audits on Bonforte Blvd between Hunter and Horseshoe Drive, and Spaulding and McCulloch.
- Bike Map is updated and accessible to public. A "proposed" layer has been created to show where possible connections and new trails could go.
- Organized Bike to work day. There were five breakfast stations and several businesses that offered discounts throughout the day.
- Help to fund another year for youth to ride free on Pueblo Transit.
- Planning to organize Bike to work month for May 2024
- Begin our 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan
- Update Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan with new projects.
